



**THE NUNAVUT COURT OF JUSTICE**  
**PRACTICE DIRECTIVE #43**  
**ASSIGNMENT OF JUDGMENTS**

Explanatory Note:

In the absence of any legislative intervention in the form of an Assignment of Judgments Act, the Court makes the following practice directive to accord with common law practice.

---

***Form of assignment of judgment***

1. Where, a judgment creditor assigns a judgment to another person, the assignment shall be in Form A, or to the like effect; and, in the case of a second or subsequent assignment thereof, the form shall include a reference to all previous assignments and give the particulars thereof.

***Registration of assignment in court***

2. Any assignment of a judgment recovered in Nunavut shall be registered in the Nunavut Court of Justice.

***Registration of assignment by an individual***

3. Where the assignment is made by an individual, the assignment must be witnessed and there must be an affidavit of execution.

***Registration of assignment by a corporation***

4. Where the assignment is made by a corporation, the seal of the corporation must be affixed to the assignment and the title of the officer signing on behalf of the assignor must be indicated on the assignment.

***Registration in land titles office***

5. An assignment of a judgment may be registered in the land titles office by executing a transfer of caveat in the prescribed form (*Consolidation of Land Titles Act*, SNWT 1988 c 8 (Supp), ss 143, 144.1. (1), as enacted for Nunavut, pursuant to the *Nunavut Act*, SC 1993, c 28).

This practice directive comes into force on June 1, 2012.
