

Library Wi-Fi Policy

The Law Library provides Wi-Fi access for members of the Law Society of Nunavut. Primarily it is intended for use by lawyers who are based outside of Nunavut and are visiting Iqaluit and do not have access to their own workstations and internet. However, it is open to all members of the Nunavut Bar. Members may obtain access by requesting it from the Manager, Court Library Services.

Special access may be granted in certain circumstances to visiting judiciary, experts who are testifying in court/participating in Quasi-Judicial board hearings, and contract court staff such as court reporters. This shall be at the discretion of the Manager, Court Library Services and must be for the purposes out lined below.*

The following groups shall **not** be able to access the Library Wi-Fi:

- Government of Nunavut employees, either those who work for Court Services or other GN departments; the exception being lawyers who work for the Nunavut Legal Services Board
- Members of the public
- Media

Wi-Fi is provided for the purpose of accessing the Library catalogue, legal databases, legal research, and accessing of email/data services by lawyers.

Any client found abusing this privilege will be removed from the service by *Information Technology* staff of Court Services who shall monitor it's use.

Use of this service is bound by this policy. All Library Wi-Fi users are prohibited from viewing, downloading, installing, sending, or forwarding any inappropriate material, including chainmail, pornography, games and/or executable files of any kind.

*If the Manager, Court Library Services is not available than access may be granted by applying to the *Information Technology* staff; use will be subject to the patron and use criteria outlined in this policy.
